2012 began with record warmth, little snowfall, & lots of optimism for an early spring season. While these mild temperatures were enjoyed by many (excluding some winter sports enthusiasts & those businesses dependent on the winter weather) it was a foreboding of some of the problems to follow. A late March freeze followed the warm spell, damaging many fruit crops that had bloomed early, wreaked havoc on alfalfa, & affected other crops. Warm currents blew in True Armyworm moths that laid eggs which lead to a widespread invasion of True Armyworms that devastated many crops & affected most every farm in Western New York.

This early warmth & dry weather

allowed much early field work, fertilization, & weed control, but also came at a time when we normally publish our spring newsletter. This early surge in business prevented us from completing our annual newsletter's 2012 edition, much to our chagrin. The unusually warm winter also lead to the winter survival of other pests, reminding us of the importance of including insecticides in our spray programs.

A severe drought hit numerous states, & New York was no exception. These drought conditions drove commodity prices to record, or near record highs, as a result of the crop damage. Luckily for many Western New

York growers, we were not hit as hard as our comrades to the west. When the season concluded, the consensus was "we weathered the storm" and most had a successful year.

Investing in Our Future - Investing in Your Future

CE-Crocker has continued to grow and make investments in our facilities & equipment to ensure our long-term viability and improve our services.

Prior to the 2012 season we drastically improved our liquid fertilizer plant by installing an automated, computerized, overhead load-out system, consisting of two overhead mixing tanks. We also added a new 4-hopper tri-axle delivery tender, two more road tractors, another delivery van truck and one more van trailer.

Since the conclusion of the

2012 planting season, we have made numerous other improvements and additions. We enlarged and remodeled our cornmeal plant office and added a new Dickey-John automatic tester for moisture and test weight sampling. We've added two dry tender delivery trucks, two single axle tractors, one Case IH and two Rogator sprayers, and a Nutrisphere treater for pre-treating urea. We have also added more liquid storage tanks, enabling us to store over 1 million gallons of liquid fertilizer.

We have a brand new dump

trailer ordered for delivery this spring, as well as a new pull spreader that can be used between 30" corn rows. We have been progressing on painting our fleet of delivery vehicles an attractive shade of blue. Due to the rapid growth we have experienced since 1999, (the year CEC was formed) we have had a mixture of colors as we purchased used vehicles to

expand our fleet. The lineup is looking much more uniform. There is more work to do when the season ends.

What Did We Learn in 2012?

Three things we learned from communication from our customers in 2012:

1. Fungicides on their wheat paid tremendous dividends. Prosaro™421SC from Bayer fights scab and provides disease protection resulting in substantial yield and quality gains. Apply at early flower (Feekes Growth Stage 10.51) as a preventative for Fusarium Head Blight. Apply as a preventative foliar spray when the earliest disease symptoms appear on stems and leaves. See label for complete instructions.

Other fungicides, such as Tilt®, can be applied early with your spring herbicides and offer cost

-effective protection and control against rust and leaf spot diseases. Products such as Quilt® can be applied at flag leaf to control several fungal diseases.

- 2. Insecticides are a costeffective insurance policy for
 just a few dollars per acre to
 add to the spray tank when
 making applications. The growers that made this decision
 reaped the benefits. Those
 that didn't, wished they had.
 Save your crop and save yourself an extra trip across the

Feeding Your Crop

Feeding your crop is like feeding your body. Your body needs a well-balanced, nutritious meal with the correct balance of nutrients and vitamins to survive and strive. Nitrogen assists plants in growing green and strong - much like we need protein. Plants need phosphorus for energy - like we need carbohydrates. While calcium gives us strong bones, potassium

gives plants strong stalks and helps fight stress and disease. Micronutrients for plants are much like vitamins for our body - necessary to keep our body in balance and healthy.

All of these things, and more, need to be in balance for your body, or the plant, to utilize efficiently. Soil pH must also be acceptable to make these nutrients available. You can plant

the top genetic seeds, supply the optimum N, P and K, but still not maximize your yields if your pH and micronutrients are out of balance.

A crop farmer needs to "balance the ration", much like a dairyman with his herd. And a dairy farmer needs to "balance the ration" on his crop as well.

Were you aware that there are numerous seed banks around the world, storing seed genes in the event of a monumental crisis? The most intriguing? The Svalbard Global Seed Vault located on a Norwegian Island near the Arctic Ocean and a mere 1,100 kilometers from the varieties of seeds from all over North Pole.

Opened in 2008, it is spon-

sored from funds donated by the (Bill & Melinda) Gates Foundation, DuPont™/Pioneer®™ Hi -Bred, Syngenta®, Monsanto™ and Rockefeller Corporations, and the Government of Norway, among others. The facility has capacity to conserve 4.5 million the world.

The 'Fort Knox' for seed is kept

at -18°C (0°F) with limited oxygen. The seeds are stored in four-ply sealed envelopes, and the permafrost surrounding the facility will help maintain low temperatures in the event of a power failure. Prior to construction, a study estimated the vault could preserve seeds from most crops for hundreds of years, and some varieties possibly thousands of years!


